Our weekly celebration/proud award assemblies help the children to celebrate their good behaviour. This is a reward accessible to all children and is celebrated across school on a weekly basis. If a child is displaying inappropriate behaviour a clear warning system is in operation to enable them to put things right.

The Acorn Trust feel it is vital to separate the behaviour from the child and discuss incidents at their level. They clearly understand that every day is a new day. We operate a restorative approach to dealing with specific incidents in order for the child to understand and put right what they have done.

Our behaviour policy reflects our Christian Values and this is celebrated through our individual class awards.
